

About complaints and counter-complaints

His turn. **Mr. André Hirsch** who was implicated, not only by the landing of a plane of his company in Greece (the case of which is currently being heard in the Greek courts), but that the complaints and counter-complaints raised by the case of the “merchant” officer Nyad mixed up with the judicial headlines, writes to us:

This is how the **Efisa** company always settled, given the evidence provided??? [*preuves en mains*], on American funds.

The investigation of these cases, both on the part of the Geneva courts and the Greek courts, will clarify these shadowy disputes and we will not fail to record its conclusions.
