# Argentina, Egypt first in swim

Argentina's Horatio Iglesias and Abou Heif of Egypt yesterday took top team honors in the 24-hour marathon swim in covering 164½ laps on the ½-mile course on Lac St. Louis, near La Tuque. Each collected \$1,750 of the \$10,500 total purse.

Johann Schans of Holland and Mohammed Gamie of Egypt finished second, two laps behind, and collected \$1,000 each.

Jorge Lopez, also of Argentina, and Steve Ramsden of Toronto finished in fourth with 140 laps.

Ten out of 15 two-man teams that started the race finished the 24 hours with the fastest lap being turned in by Harry Wickens of Fort Lauderdale, Fla., who covered the course in 51 seconds, but later dropped out of the race.

**AL OERTER**, four-time Olympic discus gold medal winner, ended his athletic career Saturday after shattering the New York AAU meet record with a throw of 181 feet, 7 inches at Elmira, N.Y. Oerter had intended to retire after the Compton Invitational meet about six weeks ago, but he said he was committed to this meet. "It's been a lot of fun, but at my age getting into condition is becoming an effort . . . I don't think anyone will match my Olympic record," he said. He also said a pinched nerve in his neck was acting up and he didn't want to risk permanent damage.
