GROSSMAN RECEIVES AWARD

Newport, R.I. — Joe Grossman, secretary of the World Professional Marathon Swimming Federation, was named first recipient of the Davids-Wheeler Trophy, an award established this year to honor those who have made outstanding contributions to the sport of professional marathon swimming.

A jury of endurance swimmers and race organizers presented the award to Grossman during ceremonies following the third annual distance swimming race in Rhode Island in August.

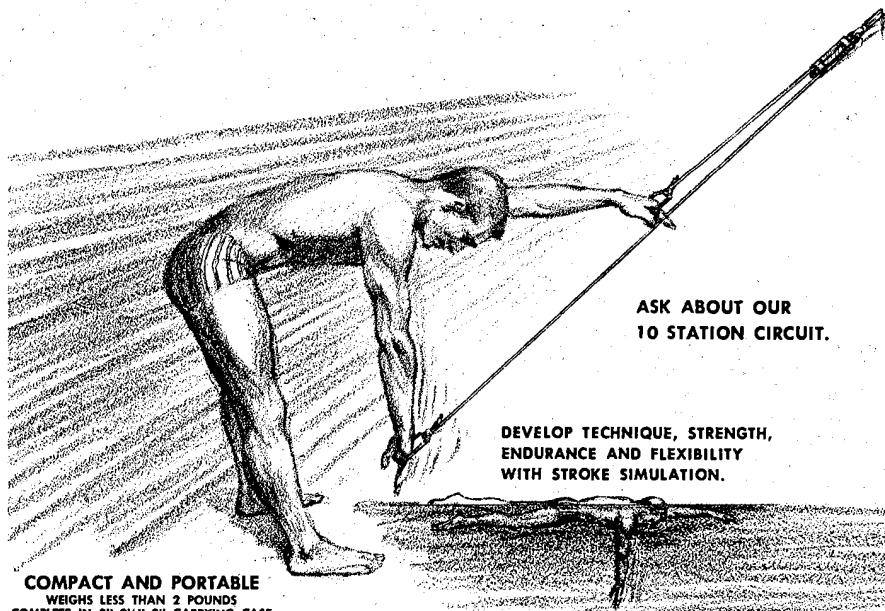
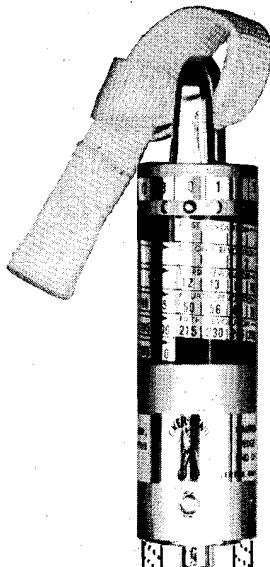
A permanent engraved silver tray bearing the names of the honorees will be kept in the International Swimming Hall of Fame in Ft. Lauderdale, Fla. Each year's winner will receive a trophy.

The award was created to honor the memories of Irving Davids of New Bedford, Mass., a former marathon swimming coach and historian of the sport; and Capt. Roger W. Wheeler of Narragansett, R.I., internationally known water safety and rescue expert or originated the series of Rhode Island races. Both men died within the past year.

Grossman, who resides in Columbia, Md., and is a foreign service officer in the U.S. Information Agency, is a former newspaperman who became associated with marathon swimming when the series of races was originated in Atlantic City, N.J., where he was working in 1954. In 1963, when the WPMF was founded, he was elected its secretary and has been re-elected ever since.

He served as coach for Greta Andersen and assisted her on her record-breaking England-to-France English Channel swim in 1964. The David-Wheeler award committee also cited Grossman for having compiled the first and only complete record book of the sport of marathon swimming and for his work in establishing new races around the world.
