

**38 11 pm: STORM begins.**

**Nyad tells Tavis Smiley she treaded water during the storm:**

**DN:** We just tread water, and we just hang out, out in the open ocean....  
**TS:** You treaded water for an hour and 20 minutes?  
**DN:** Yeah, and I was hanging on.... (16 Sep 2013)

**Members of her team say she swam:**

**Update Reported by Candace Hogan September 1, 2013 at 11pm. Swim Time: 38:00**  
 Everybody on board Voyager is battered down and Diana is still swimming strong, says Ops Chief John Berry.  
**1:27am Monday September 2, 2013. Swim time: 40:27 Reported by: Candace Hogan**  
 It happened quick and it came together in a hurry, said Roger. Diana was great, they just circled her and she kept on swimming.

**12:30: STORM ends.**

**1:37: Nyad's losing it, pulled by current and/or whatever she's tied to.**

Diana is always veering right, away from the boat... More confusion than I've witnessed before... She is behind the boat and there is concern she has gotten under the boat.

**2:00: First feeding since storm**

Diana came in for the first time since we've resumed formation, for a feeding.

**2:37: Diana defies Prime Directive (see 2:52 below).**

**She's clearly a mess. Maybe here's where she gets out.**

Diana switched to breast stroke...she then stopped and asked: "Are we there?"  
 She then told Bonnie that she wanted to change into a different swimsuit or something like that. Everyone noted that was a good sign. She's thinking about how she wants to arrive in Key West.

*Does anyone think that far ahead — or think at all — about how they're going to look when they arrive after a 60-hour swim? If this were a real swim, she'd be thinking about WHETHER she would arrive, not about her arrival apparel. Maybe this provided an opportunity (and a signal?) to go to other side of boat and switch out swimmers.*

**"Diana" does not start back swimming for 20 minutes.**

**Meanwhile, she's moving at 2.5 - 3 mph towards Key West.**

**2:52: "Diana" defies Prime Directive second time**

Diana asks for John Bartlett what time we are getting to shore. He says six hours (puzzling) but I don't follow up.

*The real Diana never wants to know how much time remains. She has never asked before the 2:37 entry. Six hours puts them at 9 am. That makes no sense — unless maybe he's telling the substitute what time he/she can get out. [at 0500, Bartlett says, "We hope to make that landing between 4pm and 6pm today."]*

**Compare: "Diana's cardinal rule is, she never wants to know how far she has to go or how far she has gone," Stoll said. (Miami Herald, 17 Sep 2013)**

**2:57 – 4:45: Breaststroking toward Key West at 2 1/2 mph**

**Only at 2:37 and in the next three entries does "Diana" swim breaststroke (other than a single stroke at 7:30).**

**Mon. 02:57** (Diana is) back swimming.  
 Several stops and starts — **switching from breast stroke to free style...**  
**Mon. 03:49** (Diana) begins swimming again with **breast stroke.**  
**Mon. 04:45** (Diana is) back swimming, **breast stroke.**

**5:00: Stopping all the time...but still heading straight for Key West at 1.2 mph.**

September 2, 2013 at 5am. Swim Time: 44:00 Navigator John Bartlett  
*"During this time, Diana has stopped numerous times to tread water trying to restore herself."*  
 (5:10) Diana stopping and starting...periodically asking for water and nourishment...effort is to just keep her going...  
**Note that whoever's in the water is still proceeding at ~1.2 mph**

**7:15: McVeigh's Last Shift**

Diana has gotten very cold, so **the handlers were not stopping her to eat and drink overnight** in the hopes that swimming would keep her warm.

**This was disputed later, of course. But they wouldn't need to stop her if this were a fresh swimmer being dragged along. I'm thinking that 7:30 was the first feeding since 2:00. Shortly after that 2:00 feeding, someone besides Nyad may have entered the water.**


**I nominate Roger McVeigh. Here's the first entry for his last shift:**

**Shift 11 (McVeigh):**  
**Mon. 07:15** McVeigh's last shift started at 7:16 am Monday, September 2, 2013 Excitement is building

**But it doesn't seem like he wrote that. So where's McVeigh? Taking a well-earned nap? His next entry doesn't appear until 11:39.**

**7:30: Dude, where's my cap? / Fist pump — Diana back in water?**

When the whistle blew for Diana's first feeding stop since before midnight, it took her longer than normal to reach Voyager and handlers...  
*[because she was on another boat, or...?]*  
 Bonnie noted that Diana was talking and breathing better now than earlier in the night.  
*[because she hadn't been in the water?]*  
 Diana touched her head and noticed that her swim cap was missing.  
*[because she forgot to put it on when she got back in the water?]*  
 she gave a small fist pump and started stroking again.  
*[quite a nice recovery from the night's mayhem. Next stop, speech! Then next stop, Smathers Beach.]*
