WASHINGTON, D.C. -- Dutch swimmers Johan Schans and Judith De $^{
m N}$ ijs Van Berkel have won the titles of men's and women's World Champion Marathon Swimmers for 1970, Johnny Weissmuller, International Commissioner of Marathon Swimming, has announced.

Schans, 22, was a member of Holland's 1968 Olympic swimming team and turned to professional distance swimming in 1969. Last year, he was barely edged out for the world title by Horacio Iglesias of Ar-This year, Schans wrested the crown from Iglesias by a similarly small margin.

More than 90 endurance swimmers representing 17 countries participated in seven marathon swimming races sanctioned as international championship events by the World Professional Marathon Swimming Federation in 1970. All finishers in each of these races were scored on their finishing positions, finishing times and distances of courses, Weissmuller explained. The 1970 races were held at Utrecht, Holland (12.5 miles); Capri to Maples, Italy (20 miles); La Tuque, Que. (a 24hour team race); Hamilton, Ont. (10 miles); Lac St. Jean, Roberval, Que. (25 miles); Newport, R.I. (26.5 miles), and Chicoutimi, Que. (28 miles).

In capturing the men's title, Schans set new course records while winning both the Hamilton and Roberval races.  $^{
m He}$  teamed with Iglesias to win the La Tuque event, where another record was set. The Utrecht speedster finished second to the Argentinian in the Holland and Rhode Island competitions.

Mrs. Van Eerkel, who won the distaff world title for the sixth time in seven years, was the first woman finisher in the Utrecht, Capri-Naples and Roberval races. In winning three of the four events she entered in 1970, Mrs. Van Berkel regained the title she'd monopolized since entering professional marathoning in 1964. Last year she entered only one race, having married former Dutch water poloist Rob Van Berkel early in the year. The '69 women's crown was won by Miss Patti Thompson of Canada, who did not complete either of the two races she entered in 1970.

Both Schans and Mrs. Van Berkel were urged to enter marathon swimming by former Dutch swimming ace Herman Willemse, who was the first men's world champion crowned by the World Federation when it began rating swimmers in 1963. Willemse has been Schans' coach throughout his two-year endurance swimming career.

Forty-one men and four women received points for finishing races among the seven sanctioned by the WDMSF this year, Weissmuller said. The final international ratings for 1970 are:
