“[In 1940], the SOE set about training a team of secret agents to be sent undercover into Nazi-occupied France. Among these were 41 women, who fearlessly endured all manner of terrors to perform their wartime duties.”

The SOE — the Special Operations Executive — was a branch of the British intelligence service. Operatives supported the French Resistance and served as radio operators, sending messages back and forth between France and England. Four women SOE agents were executed at Dachau on September 13, 1944.
